

Billionaire and CEO of Tesla and SpaceX, Elon Musk, has very interesting ideas on how to send our people to the red planet. He came up with a rocket that can carry up with one hundred people to construct a launch pad on Mars. Then he will construct another rocket for carrying people and resources in particular. It's a brilliant plan because of the need to colonize Mars. As many scientists have said, this colonization is of pure curiosity and wonder. We could look into interesting things such as unmanned rovers, source of natural resources and others. But the main reason is that Mars is a perfect way to prevent human extinction.

There is an annual worldwide university Mars rover challenge. This is called the 'University Rover Challenge" (URC for short). This is a premier challenge for college students around the world to build Mars rovers and compete for first place with 34 other teams. Captain of the Manipal Institute of Technology based in India, Tushaar Neb, shared his thoughts with The Young Opinion on the Mars colonization, "It will not happen soon but it will happen for sure.

If we keep up the pace of green ideas and as well as making sure these ideas reach all corners of the earth, we could be on Mars in the near future. Mars is known to be habitable (due to the findings of traces of water) and will be useful to our rapidly increasing population. However, we should not arrive on the surface of the red planet at the cost of earth." Mr. Neb has led his team to seventh place out of 34 teams worldwide, also making his team the first in India.

Tushaar Neb has mentioned something very important, "We should not arrive at Mars at the cost of the earth". This means many things and it is something that all of us should understand. We should not go to mars just when our Earth is about to die. We must start by taking care of the blue planet first and then we can focus on the red one. Colonization of Mars is a must but only for experimentation at first. We have to take care of our own issues such as climate change, poverty, overpopulation, world hunger, pollution and the list goes on. Our beautiful blue earth is more important than something that is thousands of kilometres away.
